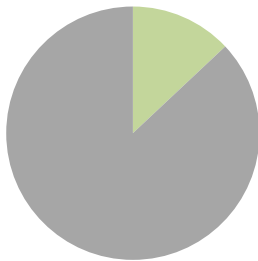


Hamilton Community Choice Aggregation Green Electricity Options

The Town of Hamilton has obtained a cheaper, cleaner electricity option than basic service for its residents and businesses. While National Grid continues to be responsible for the delivery and reliability of electricity provided to the Town, you now have control to choose where your electricity comes from.

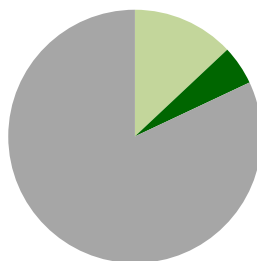
What are my options?



Hamilton Basic

Your electricity comes from traditional sources which also includes a renewable energy amount as required by law.

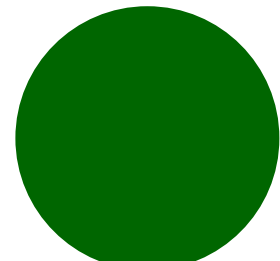
Call supplier to enroll.



Hamilton Local Green

Your electricity has **5% more Class 1 renewable energy** than required by law. And for Hamilton's residents it's **17% cheaper** than basic service through April 30, 2019.

Default option.



Hamilton Premium Local Green

Your electricity comes from **100% Wind Class 1 resources**. And for Hamilton residents it's **2% cheaper** than basic service through April 30, 2019.

What is Class 1 renewable energy and why does it matter?

Class 1 resources are new renewable energy projects (built after 1997) that generate electricity from wind, solar, hydro and biomass. These new resources can take over electricity generation from conventional resources such as coal, oil and natural gas lowering the need for fossil fuels in the region and reducing our emissions of greenhouse gases. 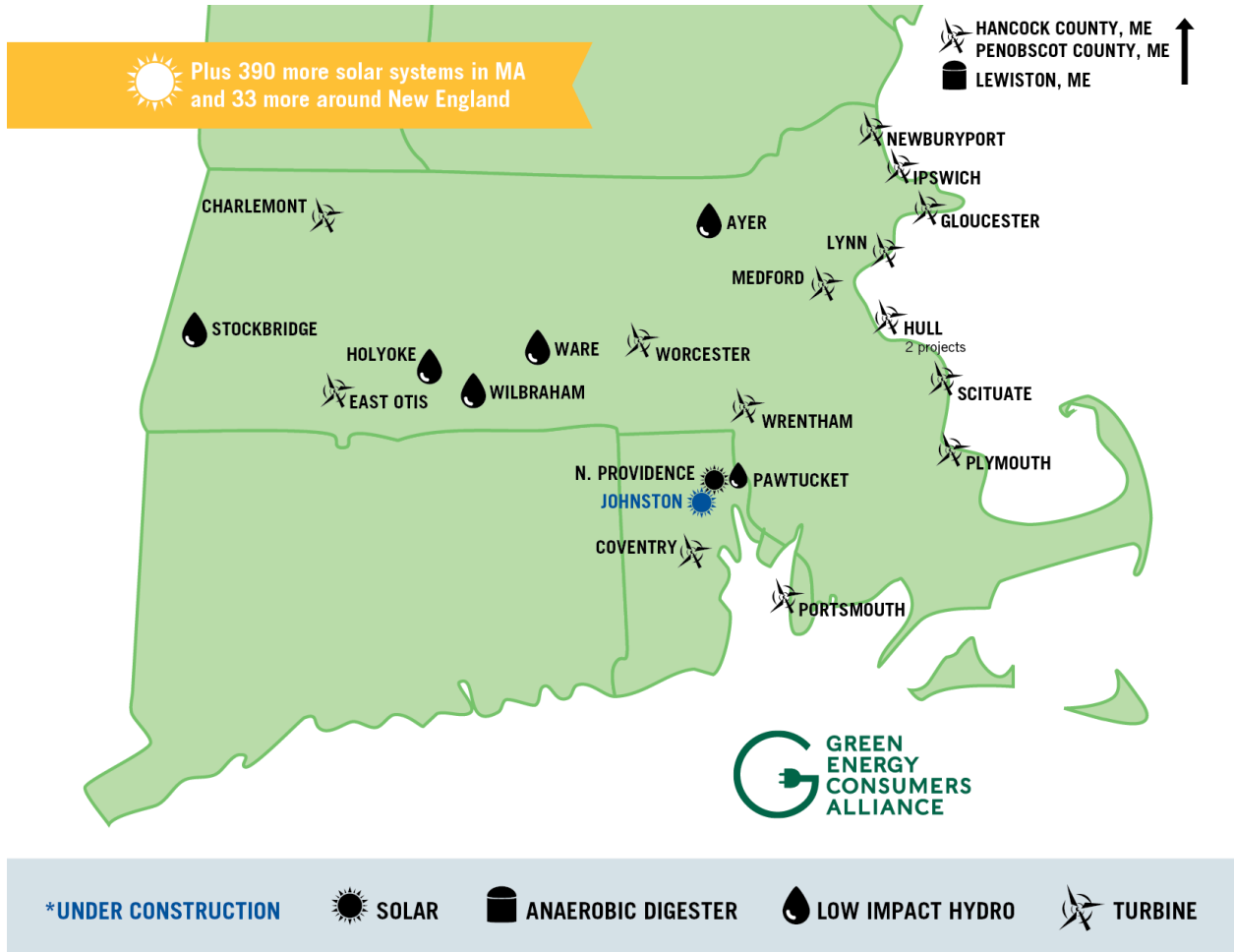
